



# How to write good learning objectives

When you are writing learning objectives, you want to use [Bloom's taxonomy](#) – please be sure to check the video on the link!

You want to ensure that you are using the right [verbs](#) and you are as specific as possible. Try and avoid using verbs such as “understand” or “familiar with” and replace them with more specific and action-oriented verbs.

The reason for choosing action-oriented verbs is that those are measurable and therefore we can measure if learning really happened. A good exercise for this is to see if a learning objective is well written is to put it into this sentence:

“Ada, please come in front of the class and understand workspace safety tools” - we can see that this would not work!:)

However, this would be good:

“Ada, please come in front of the class and describe the main workspace safety tools”
